Day School Leadership Training Institute (DSLTI): Preeminent program for new and aspiring heads of school will now have broader reach across North American Jewish day schools.

June 2, 2023 -- To strengthen the capacity of leaders to serve their schools and communities, Prizmah: Center for Jewish Day Schools and The Jewish Theological Seminary (JTS) today announced that the Day School Leadership Training Institute (DSLTI) is now a partnership between the two organizations—enhancing learning and networking opportunities for program participants. The new partnership puts the landmark leadership development program on a path of continued growth and sustainability, positioned to effectively cultivate talent and invest in the next generation of day school leadership.

DSLTI was founded in 1998 as a project of the William Davidson Graduate School of Jewish Education at JTS, in partnership with The AVI CHAI Foundation, to address the need to help train and support aspiring and new heads of Jewish schools. DSLTI brings together cohorts of leaders with diverse approaches to Jewish practice and educational philosophy from across North America.

"For the past 25 years, DSLTI has proven its model, successfully training over 200 day school leaders. Through the new partnership of JTS and Prizmah, who both share a commitment and passion for nourishing new and aspiring day school heads, DSLTI will have an elevated ability to serve the field," says Cheryl Maayan, incoming director of DSLTI at Prizmah and successor to Dr. Ray Levi, who led the program for many years.
