Critical Thinking

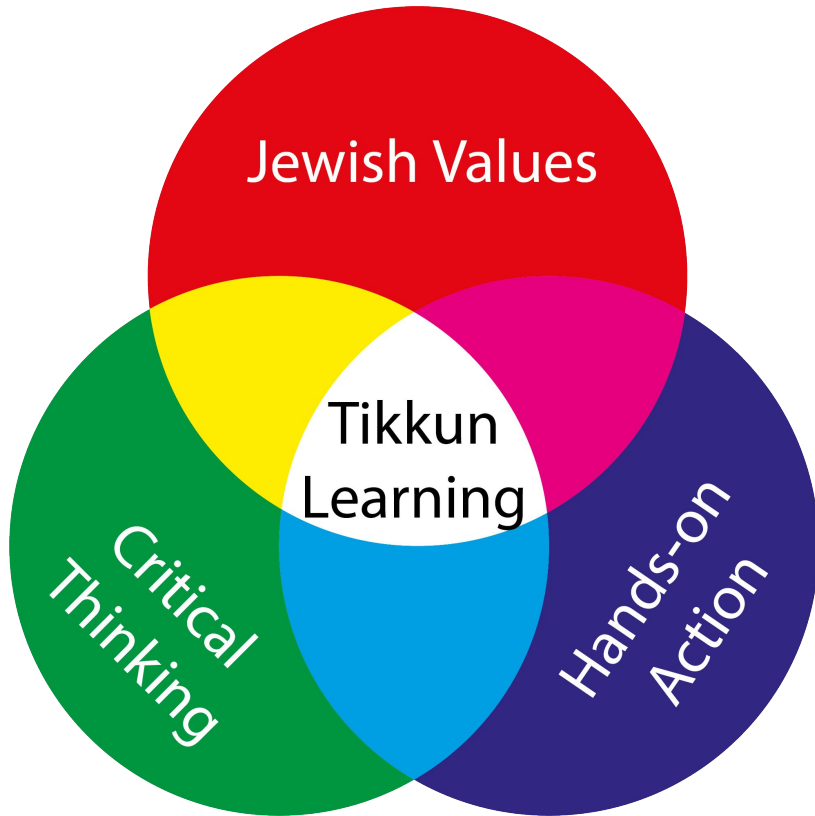
- Makes informed choices

Jewish Values

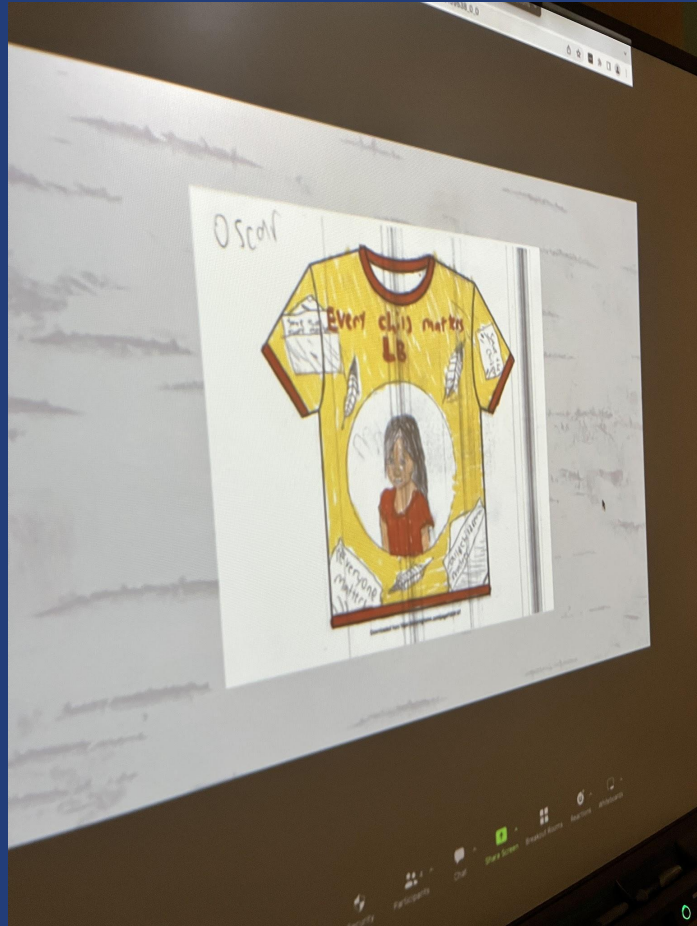
- Makes connections between personal actions and Jewish values

- Leads by example



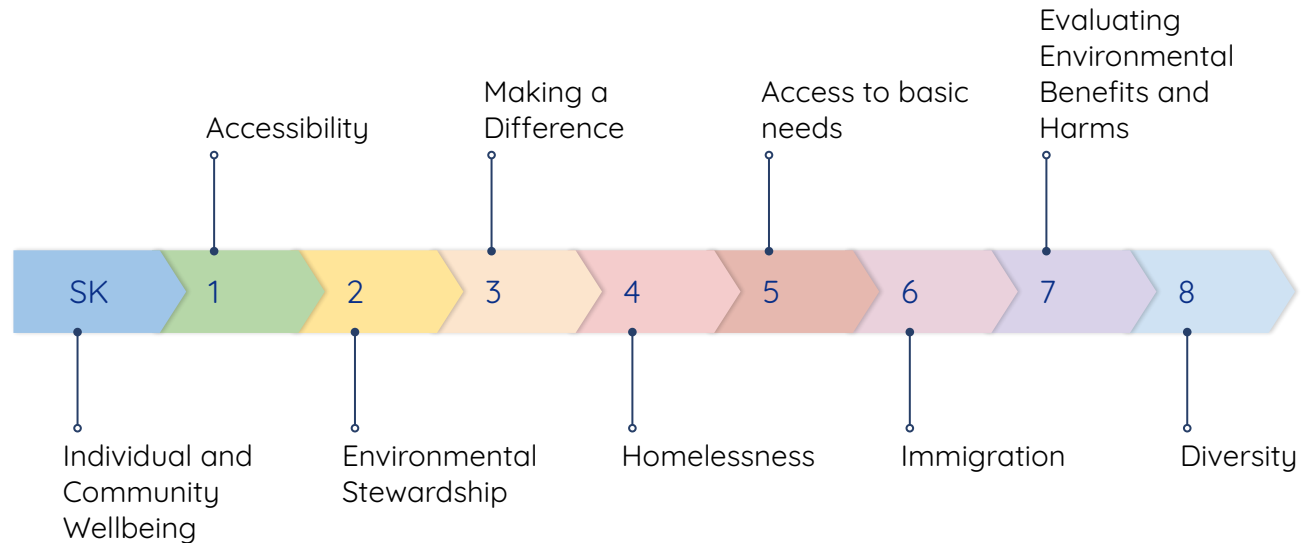
